

# Photography Gear Checklist

A practical PDF for beginner photographers, students, assistants, and new freelancers packing reliable camera, lens, lighting, power, and backup kits.

**PACKING RULE** Pack for the shot list, not for anxiety. Bring the essentials, the specific tools required by the shoot, and a simple backup plan for paid work.

## 1. Beginner camera kit

Category	Essential	Can wait
Camera	One reliable body with charged battery and strap.	Second body, cage, grip, specialty viewfinder.
Lens	Kit zoom or normal zoom plus one fast prime.	Multiple specialty primes, ultra-wide, long telephoto.
Media	Two or more memory cards from a trusted brand.	Large card wallet before you need many cards.
Power	Two batteries, charger, cable, and wall adapter.	USB power bank, dummy battery, V-mount system.
Bag	Padded bag or insert that fits camera, lens, cards, batteries.	Large roller or modular production case.
Care	Lens cloth, blower, rain cover, microfiber towel.	Full sensor cleaning kit unless trained.

## 2. First-upgrade decision guide

[ ]	If photos are soft because of low light, buy a fast prime lens before a new camera body.
[ ]	If the camera dies during sessions, buy spare batteries and a better charging routine.
[ ]	If files feel risky, buy more memory cards and a backup drive before buying another lens.
[ ]	If portraits look flat, buy a reflector, modifier, or beginner light before buying a premium body.
[ ]	If paid shoots are starting, invest in reliability: backups, bags, cases, straps, and insurance.

<input type="checkbox"/> Lens cloth and blower	<input type="checkbox"/> Lint roller
<input type="checkbox"/> Gaffer tape	<input type="checkbox"/> Phone charger
<input type="checkbox"/> Small multitool	<input type="checkbox"/> Location address and parking info
<input type="checkbox"/> Notebook and pen	<input type="checkbox"/> Studio access instructions
<input type="checkbox"/> Call sheet or shot list	<input type="checkbox"/> Emergency contact

## 4. Lighting and grip checklist

Need	Pack or confirm	Notes
Natural light	Reflector, black foam core, clamps, tape.	Useful for portraits, products, and small studios.
Flash	Strobe or speedlight, trigger, receiver, spare batteries.	Test trigger and sync before leaving.
Continuous light	LED, power cable, stand, modifier, dimmer setting.	Check color temperature and fan noise.
Modifiers	Softbox, umbrella, diffusion, grid, flags.	Pack only what matches the look.
Grip	Stands, sandbags, clamps, boom arm, tape.	Safety matters more than one extra light.
Color	Gray card or color checker.	Shoot a reference frame when color matters.

## 5. Studio or rental gear checks

<input type="checkbox"/>	Ask what camera-adjacent gear the studio includes: lights, stands, modifiers, triggers, tables, backdrops, tether station.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Confirm whether batteries, chargers, extension cords, sandbags, paper sweeps, clamps, and props cost extra.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Bring your own trigger, memory cards, card reader, tether cable, color card, and backup drive when possible.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Label your gear before working in a shared studio or with a larger team.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Photograph rented gear before and after use if condition or damage responsibility is unclear.

## 6. Media, backup, and file workflow

Step	Action	Check
Before shoot	Charge batteries, clear backed-up cards, update shot list.	<input type="checkbox"/>
On set	Keep full cards separate from empty cards.	<input type="checkbox"/>
During break	Copy key files to laptop or backup drive when practical.	<input type="checkbox"/>
After shoot	Make two copies before formatting any card.	<input type="checkbox"/>
Delivery	Name folders by client, date, project, and version.	<input type="checkbox"/>
Archive	Store originals, selects, exports, and notes in one structure.	<input type="checkbox"/>

## 7. Final door-check

<input type="checkbox"/>	Camera body, lens, memory cards, charged batteries, strap, and quick-release plate are packed.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Shot-specific lens, lighting, trigger, modifier, stand, clamp, and power items are packed or confirmed at the studio.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Call sheet, address, parking, access code, client contact, releases, and shot list are saved offline.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Laptop, tether cable, card reader, backup drive, charger, and file naming plan are ready if the shoot needs review or delivery speed.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Bag is zipped, cards are in the case, batteries are charged, and the first frame can be made without unpacking everything.
